Announcing the next IndCom chair!

We are pleased to announce that Kevin Brooks has been approved by the IFAC Council as the Industry Committee Chair for the next triennium, starting with the 2023 IFAC World Congress in Yokohama. Final and formal approval is expected at the World Congress by the IFAC General Assembly. Kevin will take over from Tariq Samad, who will complete two terms as the founding chair of IndCom. Kevin has been

leading the Communications and Metrics subcommittee of IndCom for the last few years.

Kevin has had a long career in process control and automation in South Africa, with leadership positions in Honeywell and BluESP. In 2021 he founded APC Smart to mentor, train, and consult in advanced process control. He is also an Honorary Adjunct Professor at the University of the Witwatersrand (Wits) in Johannesburg. He holds a B.Sc in Chemical Engineering and a Ph.D., both from Wits.

Kevin was the president of the South African Council for Automation and Control (IFAC NMO) in 2013 and 2014, a period which included the hosting of the very successful IFAC World Congress in Cape Town. He is one of the industrial vice-chairs of TC6.2 on Mining, Mineral and Metal Processing.
